

March 2020 – Boerne Fire Department Monthly Report

- The Boerne Fire Department responded to 102 incidents for the month of March 2020, compared to 101 incidents in March 2019. Firefighters have responded to 335 incidents so far this year.
- Fire Department members spent a total of 190.56 man hours responding to incidents within the City limits and 461.52 man hours responding to incidents outside the City limits, for a total of 652.08 hours responding to incidents in March 2020.
- Personnel spent 19 hours attending meetings and 230 hours in training sessions during the month of March 2020.
- Fire Department members have spent a total of 2486.22 hours since January 1, 2020 responding to incidents, attending meetings, attending training sessions and participating in extra activities.
